

RATCLIFFE HICKS SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE TRANSFER PROCEDURES

Ratcliffe Hicks students may apply to transfer into the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (UAGNR), or into other baccalaureate programs at UConn. Transfer decisions will be based primarily on academic performance in the Ratcliffe Hicks School of Agriculture (RHAG). Most students apply to transfer during or after the final semester of the associate degree program.

- Complete the University of Connecticut Application for admission and **return it to the address below**. When the application is processed through the UAGNR/RHSA Office of Academic Programs, the processing fee will be waived, DO NOT SEND A CHECK. Applications will be sent from our office to the University Admissions Office. Online applications can not be used in this process.

- In order to receive full consideration, applications must be submitted to the RHAG/UAGNR Office of Academic Programs by the application deadlines published by the Admissions Office for transfer students. We can not guarantee that applications will be reviewed and processed if they are not submitted to us by these deadlines.
- If you have completed courses at another institution that have not yet been transferred to UConn, an official transcript must be sent to:

Please notify our office that the transcript was sent. You may also send a transcript to our office, but an official transcript must still be sent to the Admissions office.
- Ordinarily, students who have completed three semesters in RHAG with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and who apply for transfer by the posted deadlines will be considered and notified of their admission status before graduation. All other applications will be reviewed by the RHAG/UAGNR committee after current semester grades are posted and transcripts are distributed.
- The committee's recommendations will be sent to the Admissions Office for a final decision and processing of the application.
- The admissions office will send an official letter regarding the student's admission into the baccalaureate program.

- Course equivalency information will be provided at the time of registration. In general:

Students will receive credit for courses all completed in RHAG with a grade of C or higher, except SAAG 090, SAAG 091, and courses graded “Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory”.

Courses numbered 1-99 (graded C or higher) will be processed as transfer credits (no grades transferred) based on equivalencies in effect at time of transfer.

ENGL 104, POLS 173, and other 100 level baccalaureate courses (graded C or higher) taken as an associate degree student will be “tagged” by the registrar to allow credits and grades to be included in the undergraduate career.
