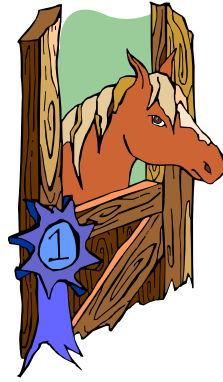

CONNECTICUT 4-H HORSE SHOW SERIES

PRIMARY OBJECTIVE

The main objective of the Connecticut 4-H Horse Show Series is to afford incentive for 4-H members the opportunity to show across the state, helping them to meet new people, experience new ideas and share their love of showing horses.

SECONDARY OBJECTIVES

- 1) To increase participation in 4-H Fair and 4-H Sponsored Horse Shows.
- 2) To increase attendance at these events, helping to promote the 4-H program as a whole.
- 3) To increase 4-H enrollments as a result of show series participation.
- 4) To target potential adult volunteers who could assist with the 4-H program.
- 5) To use the show series as a promotional tool for other State 4-H Horse Program activities.
- 6) To promote helmet safety awareness throughout the show series.
- 7) To recognize the hard work of show series participants and reward their hard work.
- 8) To promote other aspects of the 4-H program including record keeping, community service and responsible project management.

RULES OUTLINE

- 1) 4-H member must be enrolled by **April 1** of the current 4-H year and must fit all general age criteria.
- 2) 4-H member must have CT Large Animal Project Verification Form on file in their local 4-H office by **June 1**. You must also have a Connecticut 4-H Horse Show Series registration form mailed to the Middlesex County Extension Office by **May 10, 2011**.
- 3) 4-H members **MUST** submit their record book, completed to date, at their local 4-H Fair or corresponding event.
- 4) 4-H Series participants may show multiple verified project animals, however, points will be calculated for each horse and rider combination separately.
- 5) ► **Riding Class Points** will be calculated on the 7-5-4-3-2-1 scale. (7 for a top blue) These points will stand regardless of the number of riders in a class. In cases where open youth and 4-H riders are combined in a class, the 4-H rider must pin to receive points. Points totals will not be given out in advance of the awards - please do not call and request your total, or anyone else's. ► **Fitting and Showmanship** points will be given out on the Danish system first! The breakdown will be 7-5-2 for B-R-W. This will always be used unless you are at a show where the Danish system is not used for fitting at all. If no Danish ribbons are awarded, then they will have to use the riding class points system. You will not collect both types of points for any classes!
- 6) Each show committee determines rules for individual classes. All judge's decisions are final.
- 7) 4-H Series participant will be required to carry a paperwork portfolio with the following information: (regardless of show rules)
 - Certificate showing Negative Coggins – must be within 12 months prior to the show date
 - Rabies Certificate – must be current with serial number and veterinarian's signature
 - A copy of your 2011 CT Large Animal Project Verification Form signed by your county 4-H Educator.
 - Copy of registration papers – if you're animal is registered.
 - Connecticut 4-H Horse Show Series Point Forms – participants will need to present to these each participating show's secretaries. Participants will need to give the secretaries one form per horse and rider combination. Only points submitted on CT 4-H series points forms, filled out by the official show secretaries will be counted – no exceptions!
- 8) Participating Show's secretaries must fill out a points form for participating 4-H'ers.
- 9) 4-H Members must submit all points' forms to the Middlesex 4-H Office, postmarked within 2 weeks of their show date. Information must be sent to the office as "hard copy" originals from that show date showing secretary's signature. Faxed information will not be accepted.

Junior riders must be at least **7 and not yet 14 by 1/1/11**. Senior riders must be **14 and not yet 19 by 1/1/11**. These are the nationally accepted 4-H age groups for the horse project.
