WHAT IS THE MASTER COMPOSTER PROGRAM?

Almost 25 % of a typical household's waste can be recycled right in our own backyards. This significantly reduces the amount of waste that is incinerated or placed in landfills. The **UConn Home & Garden Education Center**, in partnership with the **Connecticut Recyclers Coalition**, is offering the **Master Composter Program** to educate and train state residents about the general elements of the composting process and to assist participants in passing this knowledge on to others. Those enrolled in the Master Composter program will:

- ✿ Learn why it is important to reduce the amount of waste sent to landfills
- ✿ Understand how individuals and communities benefit from making compost
- ✿ Discover the art and science of composting
- ✿ Become familiar with the techniques for creating and maintaining backyard composting systems
- ✿ Visit and learn about municipal, on-farm and worm composting methods
- ✿ Improve teaching and leadership skills through community outreach projects

Who Can Become a Master Composter?

Anyone, whether they compost now or not, who wants to **learn** more about composting and is willing to **share** their composting skills and knowledge with the public through **volunteer activities** such as presentations, workshops, exhibits and demonstrations. UConn Master Composter **Certificate & Name Badge** will be presented upon **completion of course** and **2 approved outreach activities (usually around 20 hours)**.

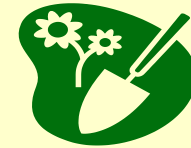
